#### Resolved

- 1 That there is one Revelation, one Church of Christ, the Second Covenant, one true religion
  - It is irrelevant that Protestants know only a part of Revelation
  - Separately, they are heretics by a second route, because they deny the remainder of Revelation

2 That regarding the Sacrament of Baptism

- Intention: for the Church of Christ is required (ie. Sectarian Baptism is valid; Jewish & JW baptism is invalid)
- Form: conferred in the Name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, identifies the Trinity, the New Convenant
- that the Sacrament is supplied by Christ, not the priest; that the priest is His instrument
- that the unbelief; denial of Revelation; heresy; unawareness that it is a Sacrament, etc. of the priest, does not invalidate Baptism

3 That the **Protestant** is an heretic

• the minimum claim to being a Protestant is Baptism; if unbaptised, the person is an Infidel

4 That the **Jew** is a pagan:

- Although baptised, they (a) are not baptised in the Name of Christ or into His Church, and (b) reject the Messias, the New Covenant.
- Circumcised (Old Covenant) instead of baptised (New Covenant)

#### Membership

On the determination of the definition of Membership in the Catholic Church, same references.

The purpose is not merely punishment of criminals, but the protection of the flock, from being infected.



# Definition 4 Reception of Converts



On the reception of converts into the Church.

### Terms

- Excommunication is vitandi or tolerati
- Excommunication due to heresy is a breach of Divine Law, not Ecclesiastic Law (but the Canons provide for it)
- Excommunication due to heresy is *ipso facto* (by that very fact), meaning that no declaration is required, and thereafter, one of two types: *latæ sententiæ* (sentence already passed, due to Canon Law) or *ferendæ sententiæ* (sentence to be passed).
